Welcome to the second issue of Institute of Quality and Productivity Management's, monthly epublication.




This newsletter primarily exists for the purpose of creating a platform for sharing knowledge and news related to Quality & Productivity community across the world.

Boeing 'shadow factories' for aircraft rework

Within Boeing's facilities, teams of engineers labour away, working not on building new aircraft but instead on fixing problems with already-built inventory. Boeing executives have begun referring to these activities with a common phrase - the 'shadow factory'.



Shadow factories exist for both the 787 and the 737 lines, tackling faults found in finished aircraft. These have included shimming issues, fuselage problems, improperly drilled holes and more. While the 737 MAX line could be some time before reworks are completed, there's a light at the end of the tunnel for the Dreamliner.

Boeing's Chief Financial Officer (CFO) Brian West believes the company is getting close to a stage where it can close its 787 shadow factory, repointing that labor at new production to the benefit of the company.

Having to spend time reworking aircraft that should be leaving the factory for customers is damaging to Boeing's bottom line. Indeed, aircraft often spend longer in the shadow factory than they do on the main production line.
